2014 Tour - South Lancashire and Merseyside

There are still some places available on this year's tour, but you are encouraged to book soon. The tour is to South Lancashire, Merseyside and Manchester. This is a fairly compact area with an absolutely splendid collection of fine buildings and organs. The particular economic conditions here have left a rich legacy of Victorian organs, many of which have remained in near original condition.

The visits will begin in the afternoon of Sunday 26 October and end in the afternoon of the following Saturday (1 November). There is unlikely to be a complete day off as there is so much to see.

We are intending to stay for bed and breakfast in the Premier Inn in the Albert Dock, Liverpool, which is an imaginatively restored area on the edge of the town centre, with restaurants, cafés and galleries including Tate Liverpool (www.albertdock.com). Visits planned include the three cathedrals in the area, Liverpool Anglican (Willis/Wells V 152), Liverpool Metropolitan (Walker IV 88), and Manchester (H&H IV 89). The town hall organs are particularly interesting and we are planning to visit St George's Hall in Liverpool (IV 121), Rochdale Town Hall (Binns IV 53) and the famous Cavaillé-Coll in Warrington (III 49). We are planning an architectural tour of Rochdale Town Hall and there will also be a visit to Port Sunlight, with its Willis II organ (IV 41) and the Lady Lever Gallery. The Theatre Organ Heritage Centre and Museum at Eccles will also be visited along with many parish churches of historical, architectural and musical importance, and we will enjoy a celebratory dinner.

1600-1720 All Saints, The Bury, Odiham RG29 1ND

After a number of rebuilds, Goetze & Gwynn in 2011 built a new organ. Gt 10, Sw 8, Ped 4.

Travel: By rail: 0900 departs London Waterloo, arr Woking **0924**; change trains; dep Woking **0930** arr **Farnham 0955**. A coach will meet this train, and will leave soon after 0955. We aim to be back in time for the **1758** arr Waterloo **1857**.

Parking: Parking, particularly at Upper Froyle, is likely to be difficult. You are advised to park for the day at Farnham station (£2) and use the coach.

Catering: Own lunch arrangements. No arrangements have been made for tea.

Costs: £5 meeting charge plus £10 coach.

SATURDAY 19 JULY - North Warwickshire and Tamworth

1130 St Editha, Polesworth

3m Taylor, rebuilt by Roger Fifield 2010 - Roger intends to be present.

1300-1400 Lunch break

There are no convenient cafes in the area, so the coach will stop at the M42 Motorway Services.

1430 Church of our Lady, Merevale

This interesting church, an Anglican parish church, was the Gate Chapel of Merevale Abbey (founded in 1148). The glory of the church is the medieval stained glass, which is amongst the most important Cistercian glass in the country. This includes the famous Jesse Window of 1330-1340, which was probably originally in the Abbey Church. The organ of 1777 is by Snetzler.

1600-1700 St Editha, Tamworth

Delightful 3m Harrison.

Travel: Tamworth is well served by rail, and you are recommended to travel by rail to **Tamworth station** if at all possible. The coach will leave Tamworth station at 1100.

It is a short walk from St Editha, Tamworth, back to the station.

Parking: Tamworth station car park has 250 spaces and costs £4.50 for Saturday parking (Pay & Display).

Parking at the churches is not straightforward. If you want to drive, it is essential you tell Colin of your intention when you book, and he will then send you an information sheet.

SATURDAY 16 AUGUST - Farnham, Upper Froyle and Odiham

1030-1200 St Andrew's, Upper Church Lane, Farnham GU9 7PW

First mention of an organ was in 1552. Large 3 manual organ rebuilt with new cases completed in 2013 by Principal Pipe Organs with John Norman as adviser, and case design by Ptolemy Dean. Gt 14, Sw 10, Ch 10 (2 from Gt), Ped 13.

1205-1305 United Reformed Church, South Street, Farnham GU9 7QU

1906 Henry Jones 2m renovated 1986 Bishops and rebuilt 2005/6 by James Richardson. Gt 7, Sw 9, Ped 4.

1305-1400 Lunch break - many small cafes around, or places to eat a packed lunch.

1430-1530 Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Upper Froyle

Next to Froyle Park Hotel, GU34 4LA, formerly Treloar School. The church is of very considerable interest. The organ was originally by Gern in 1902, altered in 1950, it was replaced by a 3-rank Walker in 1963. In 2003 Nicholson's added to/rebuilt the instrument. Gt 9, Sw 10 and Ped 5; sunken console in the chancel, pipes on west gallery.
