CLUB MEETINGS

SATURDAY 16 JANUARY - CITY OF LONDON

This is a worthy start for The Organ Club's 90th Anniversary Year. An exciting day, in and just outside the City of London, begins with the most splendid surviving 18th-century English organ in the dramatically baroque Christ Church. As an interesting contrast we go to see a restoration of an organ of the same period in one of London's loveliest churches returned to the City by Noel Mander. Finally we visit the fine new organ in St Mary-le-Bow.

1100 Christ Church, Spitalfields, Commercial Street E1 6LY

IIP 37; Richard Bridge 1735, restored by William Drake 2015. The visit will start with a short recital by Gerard Brooks. This instrument features a short compass Swell and an original Pedal organ from GG.

1400 St Vedast, Foster Lane EC2V 6HH

IIP 39; Built by Harris & Byfield for a City church in 1740, moved to a church in Fulham, moved back here and rebuilt by Mander 1962. This is a most successful early attempt at recreating an 18th-century organ in the light of the mid 20th-century.

1545 St Mary-le-Bow, Cheapside EC2V 6AU

IIP 32; Kenneth Tickell's fine 2010 organ in the most impressive case by Laurence King from the post-war restoration of the church.

Travel: Christ Church Spitalfields is about a 10 minute walk from Liverpool Street or Aldgate Underground stations. St Vedast is close to St Paul's Underground Station (Central Line westbound from Liverpool Street); alternatively Bus 100 from Wormwood Street to St Paul's. St Mary-le-Bow is a 4 minute walk from St Vedast.

Lunch: It is suggested that you find lunch in Spitalfields as there is unlikely to be much open on a Saturday around Cheapside. There are however some possible eating places to the west of St Paul's Cathedral.

Costs: £10 meeting charge (to include recital).
