2016 RENEWALS

The renewal date of all membership is 1st January. Those members due to renew were sent the appropriate form with the January *Newsletter*. If mislaid, there is a 'New member's application form' on our website, but not a renewal form. Banking data is intentionally not included, as we had interference during 2015.

If you are due to renew and your address with the Club is outside of the normal UK Royal Mail postal zone system, then you come under the **overseas payment rate**. When you make your renewal please make the payment in **£ sterling** - £35 for seniors, £40 standard rate and £20 for Juniors. If paying into the bank for transfer to the Club's account using Dollars, Euros or any other currency, please add a **minimum** of £8 to cover the bank's exchange charge for non-sterling payments plus a further sum to cover currency charges.

UK members – Standard rate £30, Senior £25 [currently aged 60 +], Juniors £10, [all to 18 years, in full time education to 25 years].

CLUB MEETING APRIL 2016

Visit to Saturday Little Venice -16th April –. Improvisation: Real Music or Ephemeral Trivia?

This will be a day of two contrasting instruments and churches. We will start with the neo-classical Collins organ in the lovely eighteenth century church of St. Mary and then cross the Regents Canal to the richly and romantically Victorian St Mary Magdalene and its large Compton organ.

In addition to the usual organ demonstrations and members' playing time, to take full advantage of these two contrasting instruments the President, Dr Stokes, will give his talk/demonstration

This explores the vital role of improvisation on the art of the organist and considers its relationship with composition of different periods and styles. It will take advantage of the qualities of both organs in relation to the styles which suit them best. Visit notes and a talk handout will be provided.

CLUB MEETING MAY 2016

Visit to Southwell Minster, Church Street, Southwell, Notts. NG25 0HD - Saturday 21st May

We will visit this delightful small town which houses the historic Minster and Cathedral of the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham.

Member **Paul Hale**, the Rector Chori (the ancient title of Organist and Choirmaster) retires in July. Paul was responsible for the design and building of the two large organs there: the 3 manual Nave organ with 44 stops, and the 4 manual Screen organ with 51 stops by Nicholson. There is also a chamber organ in the Nave, a box organ in the Choir, and a 2 manual organ in the song school. Paul will demonstrate all of the organs, and there will be time for members to play them. **The outline schedule** for the day is:

Arrive 11am - Coffee, 12.30pm -Lunch (can be pre ordered), **4.15pm Tea.**

Choral Evensong at 5.45pm with specially chosen music, and a big voluntary, to be played by Simon Hogan (Assistant Director of Music). The coach will leave Southwell after Evensong at approx. 7.15pm, to catch the 8.02pm train from Newark. **It would be helpful to have an early indication of attendance for lunch and tea, as well as for the coach.**
