Last few days for booking!

The tour will be to an area of great scenic beauty between the Pennines and the sea with a surprising number of very interesting churches and organs. We shall stay in Blackburn Cathedral quarter for five nights, in central Carlisle for one and in Kendal for the last two.

We shall visit the cathedrals of Carlisle, Blackburn and Lancaster along with most of the major parish churches in the area as well as Stonyhurst and Giggleswick Schools. We shall hear several organs influenced by the enlightened ideas of Lt Col George Dixon at the beginning of the 20th century. The last day will be a tour through the Lake District via Penrith, Greystoke, Keswick and Ambleside. There will be a tour dinner in the Fraternity of Carlisle Cathedral.
