CLUB MEETINGS

SATURDAY 15 JULY – GODALMING & WITLEY

In July we visit two churches, both with exceptionally fine organs. The Club last visited Godalming Parish Church in 2011. The second visit will be to All Saints Church, Witley, which the Club has not visited before.

1100 St Peter and St Paul's, Church Street, Godalming, GU7 1ER

Three manual/pedal organ (49 stops); restored 1961 by Hill, Norman & Beard, and more recently by F H Browne. Coffee on arrival, followed by demonstration and talk by John Belcher. Members are then welcome to play the organ.

1300 Lunch – members' own arrangements. There are several eating places nearby in the town.

Travel on to Witley (train and/or bus; full details in the visit notes).

1500 All Saints, Church Lane, Witley GU8 5PN

Organ 1871 Wm Hill, rebuilt by HNB 1937, 1965, Percy Daniel 1995. Three manual/pedal organ (25 stops). Demonstration and talk by Iain Nisbet. Members then welcome to play.

Tea and coffee will be available during the afternoon in the church.

Meeting cost: £6

Transport: Trains from Waterloo 0915; 0945; 1015; arrive Godalming 45-48 mins later. Godalming Church is a short walk from the station. Return: bus from Witley to Godalming or Guildford 1659; 1759 (full details in the visit notes).

Recital by Tom Bell to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the Frobenius organ. Music by J S Bach and Jehan Alain. Tickets at the door £10, students £5.

SATURDAY 19 AUGUST – THAMES VILLAGES & HURST

1030 Coach departs from **TWYFORD** Station.

1045 St Mary the Virgin, High Street, Hurley SL6 5NF

Historic village, church originally a Priory. The Robson organ was moved here from the Royal Apollonicon Music Hall in 1847. Altered by Martin & Coate of Oxford; Hill Norman and Beard; and now cared for by B C Shepherd & Sons.

Gt 8,8,8,4,2,III; Sw 8,8,4,4,8; Ped 16,8.

1215 St Mary the Virgin, Hart Street, Henley-on-Thames RG9 2AU

Dates back to 1180. Current organ 1887 by Hill. Most recent rebuild with new console by Tarquin Wiggins. Gt 14ss; Sw 11ss; 2 Rank Positive 8ss; Ped 10ss.

Lunch: plenty of places in Henley to eat.

1430 St Mary the Virgin, Mill Green, Station Road, Wargrave RG10 8EU

Gutted by members of the Suffragette movement in 1914, rebuilt by 1917, some older work remains. Organ 1917 Walker (BIOS certificate) rebuilt 2011 with new console.

Gt 16,8,8,8,4; Sw 8,8,8,8,4,III,16,8; Ped 16,16,8,16. Still in Walker's care.

1630 St Nicholas, Church Hill, Hurst RG10 0SN

Dates back to Norman times. In 1977, Henry Groves supplied a c1890 organ, builder unknown. Rebuilt and enlarged 1998 by White of Southampton. Recently David Coram has started to look after it. Gt 8,8,4,2,III,8; Sw 8,8,8,4,2,II,8; Ped 16. I hope there will be a cup of tea/coffee available here.

Travel: 0912 London Paddington (Platform 11; Reading train) arr Twyford 1000; 0927 (long walk to Platform 14; Oxford train) arr Twyford 1012; Reading 1003 (Platform 14) arr Twyford 10.09.

Organ Club coach: Twyford, next to Platform 4. Cost £26 per head – if coach filled, cost will reduce. Finish time 1800 at Twyford. Trains about every 15 minutes, journey time to Paddington approx 50 minutes.

Parking and events taking place: Hurley: very difficult especially as there is a regatta taking place, and a wedding after we clear the church. Henley: parking near church is impossible at any time; Rewind Festival also taking place. Parking around Hurst church is in a narrow lane and can be difficult. Please use coach. Car park at Twyford station £6.10, Apcoa code 2179. Access from north side, follow lane next to Oriental Wok, under bridge and uphill to car park. Wicker gate over Henley track onto platform 4 and station exit. Ticket machines at entry of main car park and near gate. If you miss the coach at Twyford, Henley trains every 30 minutes, St Mary's 10 minute walk from station. If you use your own car or travel with another member in their car (£5 each) be aware parking will be VERY difficult in the first two locations!

Day visit notes (six sides) will be available ahead of the visit for you to print. I am aware of costs, and hope only to print notes for those who are unable to print their own.
