The evening will be introduced by the BBC presenter of the Radio 3 programme *In Tune*, and features all the 10 first prize winners from 2011 to 2020.

Memorial Concert for organ builder John Budgen

On Thursday April 21st at 13:10, the organ builder John Budgen will be commemorated in a concert at St Margaret Lothbury, near the Bank of England in the City of London. The organists will be Margaret Phillips and Richard Townend. The organ, originally built by George Pike England in 1801, was reconstructed in 1984 (II/22) by Bishop & Son under John Budgen's leadership.
