The 3,500 pipes of this famous organ are guarded by four chubby cherubim. The opening recital was given by the composer Henry Purcell in 1684. Since that time, the organ has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading craftsmen, culminating in 2010 with a restoration by Nicholsons of Malvern.

Organists of St Michael's have included the Master of the King's Music, William Boyce (here for 32 years), Harold Darke (50 years) and Richard Popplewell. In the 19th century, the [Royal] College of Organists was founded here. There are records of a fine choir singing three services daily in 1375, and in the past century much new music (by such composers as Vaughan Williams, Howells and Harris) has been written for the choir.

The weekly Organ Recitals have been taking place since 1914. (Even during the recent lockdowns, they continued online.) Donations in the collection plate are essential if the recitals are to continue. Please be generous.
