The theme for the day is **Trocadero and Town Halls**, spanning theatre organs, town hall organs, and the music that they inspired.

Entry is free, but there is an afternoon buffet at £6, and a charge of £7 for the celebrity recital at 18:00 - 19:00, given by Richard Hills.

There will be recitals and presentations throughout the afternoon, and there are always a number of displays (including the Organ Club desk) where you can purchase music and CDs.

Saturday February 18th 2023: Stony Stratford, Shenley Church End & Stowe School Chapel

10:30 Meet at Stony Stratford (**St Mary & St Giles**); welcome and coffee/tea then [10:45-12:00] look at the organ, which is a III/38 Willis rebuilt by F H Browne in 2011. Our host for the day, Jonathan Kingston, will meet us here.

12:00 -13:30 members forage for lunch in Stony Stratford, following which those without cars are offered lifts by those with cars and proceed at 13:30 south-east to:

13:45 **Shenley Church End, St Mary**. A II/17 by Walker (c.1870 & c.1880), restored in 1926 by Kingsgate Davidson. Leave at 15:15 for:

15:45 **Stowe School Chapel**, where Jonathan Kingston will talk to us and demonstrate the famous IV/77 Rushworth & Dreaper (1929) / A E Davies (1961) / Cousans (2003), after which members can play. The afternoon ends whenever everyone has played.

There is no need to pre-book. A visit charge of £10 will be collected from members on the day.

The President writes: Club members will be delighted to learn that we have agreement from both Symphony Hall and the Town Hall to visit their wonderful organs (dates/times under discussion), invitations to play the organs in both cathedrals, a masterclass with Daniel Moult on the new Flentrop organ in the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, a day in the Solihull

area including Solihull School, a day in the Wolverhampton area including the wonderful organs at St Peter's and at Walsall Town Hall, a trip to the famous Willis at Wylde Green and the Harrison at Boldmere, plus time to explore several fine city centre churches and organs, including the 4-manual Harrison / Compton at St Martin in the Bull Ring.

Accommodation will be in the New Street Premier Inn, which Club members will need to book for themselves - though not until I can absolutely confirm the dates, please.

We plan to meet by mid/late-morning on the 13^{th} and disperse after breakfast on the 19^{th} , so that gives us $5\frac{1}{2}$ days of visits. Costs yet to be finalised - we aim to limit the use of a coach to one or two days; public transport in the area is good. Do come along: John Varney and I are so looking forward to sharing with a large group of members the organs which inspired our youth!

Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell gave the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading organ builders, and it was last restored in 2010 by Nicholsons of Malvern. Organists of the church have included the 18th century composer William Boyce (here for 32 years), as well as Harold Darke (50 years) and Richard Popplewell. The [Royal] College of Organists was founded here in the 19th century. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world (it began in 1914). It features internationally-renowned soloists, as well as gifted younger players.

The continuation of this well-known series depends on the support of the audience. Please be generous as you leave. There is a bowl for cash, as well as a card-reader (for debit or credit cards) and a QR code on display.
