Paul Hale was the advisor here and the newly rebuilt organ by Clevedon Organs was opened with a recital by Thomas Trotter on 11<sup>th</sup> February. Paul will give a talk about this instrument at the start of the visit.

The new console is pictured left.

#### How to get there

**Trains** from London area: GWR from Paddington, at XX:08 & XX:38– service to DIDCOT, 09:38 arrives Goring Station at 10:36. NB From May, GWR no

longer stops between Paddington & Slough – Elizabeth line only for intermediate stations. More details in GWR timetable T10 available online.

**By car & parking** Use M4 to Junction 12, then west on A4 to large roundabout, turn north on A340 signed for Pangbourne. A340 has many speed cameras! Centre of Pangbourne mini-roundabout – go ahead road is A329 – under rail bridge to Streatley. At traffic lights, turn right onto B4009, cross over Thames and follow church wall to the right into Manor Road, road bears left into Station Road, pub *The Catherine Wheel* on left, narrow entrance to the right leads you to *Wheel Orchard Car Park*. This is the main car park, payment – use mobile, call 0345 434 8008, location code 1420 and use credit or debit card. Alternatively, follow B4009 through village, to top, right turn at the railway bridge, and park in station car park RG8 0EP. Cheaper at £4.20 all day, electronic Apcoa Parking, location code 2129; phone 01895 262 122.

#### Saturday August 12<sup>th</sup> <u>2023</u>: Swindon Visit Communicated by Mark Jameson

Members of The Berkshire Organists' Association [BOA] are visiting SWINDON and I am very aware that quite <u>a number of</u> OC members failed to reach SWINDON in August 2022 because of a rail strike. Following the OC visit - see OCJ 2022/3 - pages 24 to 31, the organ at St Barnabas has had its stolen pipes replaced, and there are changes taking place at Holy Rood in service format. The BOA were planning this visit for 2024, but have had to bring forward in order to enjoy that organ. I am advised that the organist at Holy Rood is planning a special demo for those who attend by a well-known player.

The BOA plan is to commence the visit at Christ Church [10:45], then to Holy Rood [13:00] and finish at St Barnabas [15:30], where I hope tea can be offered. Should you wish to take part, please contact Mark Jameson [see Goring for details] More information will be provided to those who contact me - but please just don't turn up without contacting me first.

# Saturday August 19<sup>th</sup> 2023: a visit to the historic town of Newbury

Organ originally by Hunter built in 1898 using casework from former organ. Rebuilt 1963 by Gray & Davison, Trumpet rank added 1993 by B C Shepherd & Son. Major overhaul following restoration of the church, 2014. 3 manuals 36 stops.

Park either in Pelican Car Park, Pelican Lane, Newbury, RG14 1NU, Pay & Display; or Parkway Shopping Car Park RG14 1ED, pay on return; or West Street Car Park, Pay & Display, RG14 1HA. There are other car parks in West Street too.

Coffee and cake available in church hall, please bring <u>cash</u>.

**Lunch**: There are several places within walking distance of the Methodist Church to obtain lunch on Northbrook Street, or nearby.

Please organise lifts amongst yourselves for those coming by train to get to the two churches after lunch.

**14:15 St George the Martyr**, 206 Andover Road, Wash Common, Newbury, RG14 6NU.

Organ originally a small extension organ by Walker built in the 1960s. A new much larger organ was built by Walker in 2016 incorporating the existing pipes, with striking copper front pipes.

There are car parks both sides of the church.

**16:00 St John the Evangelist**, St John's Road, Newbury, RG14 7PY. The large red brick church was designed by Stephen Dykes Bower as the original church by William Butterfield was bombed in the Second World War.

The organ by Gray & Davidson was installed in 1974 by Osmond of Taunton, and came from a redundant church in Newbury, but was reduced to 2 manuals from the original 3. 21 stops.

Tea will be available, please bring **<u>cash</u>**, and the visit will end at 17:30.

There is a car park, and there is also parking in surrounding roads. It is a short walk downhill to the station.
