2. CLUB MEETINGS

Saturday November 18th 2023: Parish Church of St John the Baptist, High St, Windsor, SL4 1LS

Owing to difficulties booking venues, the previously planned visit for this date has been postponed.

We are delighted to advise that, at short notice, we have a visit to the Parish Church of St John the Baptist, Windsor - from 14:00 to 17:00.



A 14:00 start allows teachers and younger members to get there!

Some of you met John Halsey, the DOM for the Windsor Parishes, during the Windsor visit in June this year - and at the time the St John's organ rebuild was still in progress. This work is now complete, and the organ was reopened on 1st October with a recital by Thomas Trotter.

The organ is a 3-manual Hunter and the work has been carried out by Bishop & Sons - no specification changes, but the action has been totally brought up to date.

John Halsey has produced an excellent leaflet describing the organ which will be available on the day. John has agreed to demonstrate the instrument.

Minimum cost per member: £5 - if you feel able to contribute more, please do so.

HOW TO GET THERE - PUBLIC TRANSPORT

St John's is the main parish church of Windsor and is in a very busy spot. I would suggest as many as possible travel by train.

If you leave the GWR Windsor station - cross the road to the Castle side, then turn right - Guildhall ahead of you - and the church is up steep steps just beyond.

If you use SWT to Windsor & Eton Riverside - further walk - cross road and walk up the road with the castle walls, about a 15 minute walk.

May 9th – 12th 2024: Short Tour to South Devon, including Buckfast Abbey

Note from organiser Eric Shepherd:

The long-awaited visit to hear the two Ruffatti organs in Buckfast Abbey has now been arranged for May 2024. The Abbey is a busy place, and I have been trying to book a visit each year since 2020. The only day that we can have the organ to ourselves for two and a half hours is on Saturday evening 11th May 2024 from 7 – 9:30pm. We will be hosted by David Davies who is the organist there and who has kindly gone to a lot of trouble to make the arrangements for our visit. The provisional arrangements for the tour are as follows:

Thursday May 9th

Arrive at Newton Abbot and meet at the station in the afternoon at about 1:30pm.

2:30pm: St Peter & St Paul Teigngrace.

2 manual 12 stops, possibly by James Davis 1781, rebuilt 1885 George Hawkins.

4pm (approx.): St Andrew's Ashburton (to be confirmed), 3 manual Father Willis rebuilt Percy Daniel 1981, Michael Farley.

Arrive at Buckfast.

Buckfast Abbey has a 30 room 3-star hotel called Northgate House Hotel in the grounds of the Abbey which as of last week is available. If you want to stay there, you must book straight away before it becomes unavailable. They offer bed & breakfast, and the cost of a double or twin room is about £110 per night. Single occupancy is £100 per night.

There are also self-catering cottages to rent. Call 01364 645630 to book Northgate House Hotel or self-catering cottages, or look up Buckfast Abbey website $\underline{www.buckfast.org.uk}$.

A short distance from the Abbey is The Abbey Inn (not connected to Buckfast Abbey), a 3-star hotel which offers Bed & Breakfast, tel 01364 642343, 30 Buckfast Road, Buckfast, Buckfastleigh. TQ11 0EA.

Bookings can be made on various hotel booking websites and prices vary now from £63-£75 per night, breakfast is extra.

The Monday lunchtime recitals at St Michael's first became a fixture in the life of the City of London in 1914, when office workers turned to the Church for comfort from the horrors of World War I.

Some of the 3,500 pipes of the organ date back to 1684, when the opening recital was given by Henry Purcell. The latest restoration was by Nicholsons in 2010. Organists of the church have included the composers William Boyce and Harold Darke. The (Royal) College of Organists was founded here in 1864.
