#### 2024 Membership Renewals and Contact Information

Members are reminded that the renewal date for subscriptions was the **first working day of January**. Currently, too many members have ignored the request to renew – this will affect how able we are to commit plans for activities, thus making budgets difficult for our Treasurer.

All three Journals for 2023 have now been distributed, and our Journal editor has apologised for delays. All officers are volunteers and even best laid plans and hopes do go awry. The first Journal for 2024 is planned for March and the Editor confirmed [at the February Committee meeting] he is working on 2024/1.

The renewal form was on the back page of the printed January Newsletter, and as a link to download on the electronic mailing list. It can also be found on the Club's website.

About 177 members are outstanding for renewal as at mid-February. The form is again printed on page 2 of this Newsletter. I do not want to lose members, but prompt payment is vital to ensure that the Club runs properly.

#### Note from organiser Eric Shepherd:

The long-awaited visit to hear the two Ruffatti organs in Buckfast Abbey has now been arranged for May 2024. The Abbey is a busy place, and I have been trying to book a visit each year since 2020. The only day that we can have the organ to ourselves for two and a half hours is on Saturday evening 11th May 2024 from  $7-9:30\,\mathrm{pm}$ . We will be hosted by David Davies who is the organist there and who has kindly gone to a lot of trouble to make the

arrangements for our visit. The provisional arrangements for the tour are as follows:

#### Saturday May 11th

Make your way to **Buckfastleigh Station**, **The Station**, **Dartbridge Road**, **Buckfastleigh**, **TQ11 0DZ**. The station is 1.1 miles from Buckfast Abbey. It is possible to get a bus, or book a taxi. Alternatively, it is a 21 minute walk. Buckfastleigh station is on the South Devon Railway, which is a steam and diesel heritage line which runs to Totnes Riverside station. There is a visitor centre and gift and book shop at Buckfastleigh station, as well as a cafe. You can buy a return ticket at the station. **10.30am.** Train to Totnes Riverside Station, Littlehempston, Totnes, **TQ9 6LZ.** You must catch this train as the service is infrequent. It arrives at Totnes at 11.am. The walk from the station to St Mary's Priory Church in the Totnes town is 1 mile up hill. We will pre-book several taxis from the station to the church as it is quite a steep, long hill.

4.30pm. Train to Buckfastleigh Station.

5.00pm. Arrive at Buckfastleigh Station.

# 6.30pm (Optional) Vespers in Buckfast Abbey sung by the monks, accompanied by organ.

#### 7.00pm-9.30pm Visit to Buckfast Abbey

Demonstration of the organ by David Davies (until recently the organist of the Abbey), followed by a long playing session.

Organ built by Fratelli Ruffatti of Padua, Italy in 2017-2018. Quire organ 4 manuals 72 stops.

West Gallery 2 manuals 27 stops. Moveable 4 manual console in Quire. 4 manual West Gallery console. Both organs are playable from each console.

### September 12th - 16th 2024: Isle of Wight

President Paul writes:

I am excited to be organising a long weekend on the Isle of Wight for Club members in September. The dates are Thursday 12th - Monday 16th. Our base will be the Premier Inn in Newport, for 4 nights (12th-15th). Please book as soon as you are sure you'd like to be with us; you might like to book a 'meal deal' to get a reduction on an evening meal, which is at the adjacent Beefeater restaurant. There is free parking.

We will gather at Newport Minster, mid-afternoon on Thursday 12th, where the handbook will be given out and we play the fine 3-manual Forster & Andrews / Walker. Over the next three days we will explore thirteen further organs: West Wight (Friday), East Wight (Saturday), Mid Wight, (Sunday, including, we hope, a morning visit to Osborne House). We have two very special treats to round off the tour on the Monday morning: Quarr Abbey, with its Cavaillé-Coll beautifully restored by Andrew Cooper (in consultation with Club members Adrian Mumford and yours truly), then the Fishbourne ferry back to Portsmouth where Dr David Price will meet us at the Anglican Cathedral and let us loose on the superb Nicholson organ there.

Ferries and cars: we will need sufficient cars to transport the group around the Island, so please seriously considering bringing yours, if you have one. I will work on adjusting the Tour fee to compensate car drivers for the considerable extra cost of taking the car over on the ferry. Ferries should be booked from Portsmouth to Fishbourne (return).

Expression of interest: it would be such a help for Club members to inform me by Easter Day if they think they would be interested in joining in this tour, also - importantly - whether they would be prepared to drive; no commitment at that stage but getting some sort of idea of numbers and cars would help Andrew Cooper (our organ-builder 'tour agent' on the Island!) and me, as we plan.

Sir Charles Villiers Stanford was a cantankerous but inspired composer. To commemorate the centenary of his death (in 1924), his five glorious (but rarely heard) Organ Sonatas will be featured during the weekly recitals on Mondays at 1pm in ST MICHAEL'S CORNHILL in the City of London.

Norman Harper plays Sonata no 2: Monday 4 March Jonathan Rennert plays Sonata no 1: Monday 11 March Makoto James plays Sonata no 4: Monday 22 April

Richard Brasier plays Sonata no 3: Monday 20 May

Anthony Gritten plays Sonata no 5: Monday 1 July

Admission to these recitals is free.



Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell gave the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading organ builders, and it was last restored in 2010 by Nicholsons of Malvern, Organists of the church have included the 18th century composer William Boyce (here for 32 years), as well as Harold Darke (50 years) and Richard Popplewell. The [Royal] College of Organists was founded here in the 19th century. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world (it began in 1914). It features performances by our two resident organists (Jonathan Rennert and Makoto James), as well as guest recitalists from the UK and overseas.

The continuation of these recitals depends on the generosity of the audience. As you leave, you will see a bowl for cash donations, as well as a card-reader (for debit or credit cards) and a QR code on display.
