September 12th – 16th 2024: Isle of Wight

Saturday October 19th 2024: Thameside Oxfordshire Village Churches

This visit is organised by Mark Jameson.

Our plan is to visit four churches – more in the traditional way of local church visits – not quite “Padre Organ Scramble” as traffic no longer allows for this – so with some trepidation, I have booked a Newbury bus to transport members.

The churches are booked, and I now need for members to take part – **please book with me asap**. The visit needs to break even, Treasurer not keen for me to confirm the coach without evidence that the visit is viable. TAXIS & OWN CARS **are not an option** because of parking at the first two churches. There is no viable public transport option.

There is another event being held in Dorchester Abbey which is why it is not included in this visit.

HS2 WORK is taking place between Paddington & Hayes, so there is a special timetable running -

PADDINGTON to GORING & STREATLEY (G & S):

Paddington Platform 11. 08:38, calls Reading 09:15 arrives G&S 09:35. Train 2N22

READING to GORING & STREATLEY:

09:55 platform 14, arrives G&S 10:07. Train 2N24 now starts Reading, not Paddington.

PADDINGTON to GORING & STREATLEY:

Paddington Platform 11. 09:38, calls Reading 10:20 arrive G&S 10:35. Train 2N26

A bus has been booked to transport members from Goring & Streatley station to the churches and back.



Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell gave the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading organ builders, and it was last restored in 2010 by Nicholson's of Malvern. Organists of the church have included the 18th century composer William Boyce (here for 32 years), as well as Harold Darke (50 years) and Richard Popplewell. The [Royal] College of Organists was founded here in the 19th century. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world. It became a fixture in the City of London in 1914, when office workers turned to the Church for comfort from the horrors of World War I.

The continuation of this well-known series depends on the support of the audience. Please be generous as you leave. There is a bowl for cash, as well as a card-reader (for debit or credit cards) and a QR code on display.

Dorchester, St Birinus: They have recently had their first pipe organ: the lack of finishing by the builder, slated in another magazine, has now been sorted – and the reason why I waited before including in visit programme. 2018 Aubertin: Great 8,8,4,2,2²/₃,1³/₅, MIII, Positif: 8,4,2, 2²/₃, 8 Pedal: B16.

Clifton Hampden, St Michael: Historic church beside the Thames, organ c1920 Phipps of Oxford. Great: 8,8,8,4,4,2, Clarinet, spare slide, tremulant. Swell: 16[TC], 8,8,8,8,4, Oboe, Pedal: Bourdon 16+8.

Benson, St Helen: c1880 Forster & Andrews installed 1905 C H Walker repaired 1988 Robin Rance after water damage. Great: 8,8,8,4,4,2, MII [1988], Clarinet, tremulant. Swell: DD16 [TC], 8,8,8,4,2, Cornopean, Oboe. Pedal: 16, 8.

Warborough, St Laurence: Another historic church, with personal family connections. The current main organ, Willis transplanted from Summerfields School, Oxford installed by a village team with guidance by Brian Carlick. Pedale B16, Great: OD8, Claribel Flute 8, P4, Ha F 4*, F2, MII Swell: 8,8,4,2, Cornopean Swell. * Flute from A&S organ.

2nd organ, out of use, only with very careful playing, bellows leaking: Abbott & Smith, not sure of date: Pedal: Harm Bass 32, B16, BF8. Great: OD8, Clarabella 8, Dul8, P4, HF 4, Clarionet 8.
