(b) Car: coming from the south west expect M5 to be very busy around Jn 11, those from London **not** to use the direct route M4 and A417 (this links through to M5 Jn11) and when using the route of A40 expect heavy traffic between Oxford and Burford, because the International Air Tattoo is taking place at FAIRFORD **all** weekend, with special extra displays because of RAF 100th anniversary. The M4/A417 route locks solid under normal air-display weekends, but this display is to be much larger and longer. Traffic for Fairford turns off A40 at Burford.

Saturday August 18th 2018 - The Isle of Thanet, Kent

We visit this comparatively little known corner of Kent, which has been badly neglected by the Club. Broadstairs and Ramsgate are places of considerable character. The last visit to this area was in 1969, when churches in Margate were visited. Club member Tony Bullett was born in Thanet, and suggested this visit to some of the churches that he is familiar with. We start at the historic church of St Peter-in-Thanet on the edge of Broadstairs, before going to the town for lunch and a visit to the church near the harbour, then travel to Cliftonville in Margate, and finish at the magnificent church of St George's Ramsgate with a fine largely unaltered 4 manual organ by Hill of 1896. Do come and explore this interesting area by the sea in the middle of the summer.
