At the 2018 AGM it was agreed that there would be one ORDINARY adult rate, expected as £30 - unchanged from the previous Standard rate. It was agreed as under the new GDPR rules, as I am not allowed to ask adults for date of birth, I cannot operate a concessionary rate for seniors. However, if any member can enrol a new member, then a single £5 reduction per year but you needs to name the new member. Student members are now termed as YOUNG members, this applies to all up to the age of 18 [as before] but if you are in full time study or apprenticeships the upper age limit was raised from 25 to 30. Once normal salaries are received, ORDINARY rate applies. The YOUNG members' rate was set in c1998 at 50% standard rate, so for 2019 the annual YOUNG member rate is raised for the first time in 20 vears from £10 to £12.
