Playing standards

At a recent meeting it became clear that some of those who attend are unsure of how we try to ensure good standards with playing.

If you wish to play, you sign the playing sheet that our Console Steward [usually David Willey] has, and after the demonstration and the opportunity for those wishing to photograph the console, he will read a playing list, usually starting with the most skilled and then alternating with less skills.

When the console is requested by many attending, it may be necessary to put the 5-minute rule in place - 5 minutes includes registration as well as playing. He will normally rotate players so as many as possible have the opportunity to play. Some players may ask for registration assistance, but others do not, so please do not change stops whilst someone is playing without their agreement.

Our skilled players can go to a console not previously seen and produce good music, but those with less experience may play a piece well on the organ known to you, but trying to play the same on a different instrument in front of other players can be hard work - so please if you are by the console keep your comments to yourself.

The Organ Club is there for education and enjoyment. Numbers attending meetings have dropped in recent years - and I would like to see greater member participation.

Organ by Nicholson 1879, rebuilt by Rushworth and Dreaper in 1927 and 1977, and further overhauled by Nicholson in 2003.
Great 10 Swell 14, Choir 6, Solo 8, Pedal 10

Travel: The 08:22 from Paddington (destination Hereford) arrives at Malvern Link Station at 10:59. Arrive at train at least 2 minutes early.

WALKING is the best route from Malvern Link Station to St Matthias, Out of the station – and on to the main A449 Worcester Road. 2nd Left is Cromwell Road – opposite a post office – turn into Cromwell and to end – sharp left at end of road. Turn right into Redland Road – and St Matthias on right – entrance in Church Road.

St Matthias to St Leonard Newland, WR13 5AX
RETRACE route back to A449 Worcester Road

BUS 44/44A/44B short journey to Townsend Way – large roundabout with A449 bus stop opposite URC Church on A449, 4 buses per hour - about 4 or 5 bus stops . St Leonards on Right.

Walkers – along Church Road to end – turn right at end into Lower Howsell Road and at A449 turn left. Carry on until you get to the roundabout – a big Morrisons on the right – where you pick up the bus to get back to MALVERN. To MALVERN - No.44 bus calls at Morrisons at xx.41, xx56, xx11 & xx.26 Church Street nearest point to Priory – timetable running time 22 minutes Return train from Gt. Malvern Station at 1745, arrives Paddington at 2027.

3 manual organ by Norman and Beard 1902 recently restored in 2015 by Harrison and Harrison Ltd
We will be met here by Ian Ray (borough organist and organist of Lion Walk) who has very kindly arranged our visit here today

12:00-13.30 Lunch Break - numerous eating places within the town centre

13:30-15:00 Lion Walk URC, Lion Walk Precinct CO1 1LX
Organ built for the new church in 1986 by Hill Norman and Beard incorporating most of the old Willis/Walker organ from the old church of which just the spire remains

Great 16, Swell 14, Choir 13, Pedal 17

There is much borrowing of reeds from one department to another.

15:15-16:45 St. James P.C., East Hill CO1 2QW
Much of this organ was from the old church of St Nicholas which stood imposingly in the High Street. The organ at that time had three manuals but is now just over 2 manuals as rebuilt by Cedric Arnold in 1970

Great 11, Swell 14, Pedal 11

Teas and Coffees will be available.

17:00-18.30 St. Boltoph P.C. Church Walk CO2 7EE
The organ that we see today was originally a two manual Walker rebuilt with all new mechanical action to the manuals by Cedric Arnold in 1966

Great 7, Swell 7, Choir 5, Pedal 10

Parking is not possible at any of these venues: however Colchester does have numerous car parks with one at Castle Road which is just off Roman Road opposite St James Church and costs £7 for 12 hours.

There is also 'park and ride' at Junction 28 of the A12, CO4 5JA with frequent buses into the Town Centre, but please check times of last buses back in the afternoon. Cost £3.

This bus service, I am fairly certain, also stops at the Railway Station. There are frequent rail services into Colchester and the fast train takes approximately 50 minutes from London Liverpool Street.
