Cautionary note for subscribers to *Choir & Organ* magazine

Mark Jameson is a subscriber to *Choir & Organ* (C&O) magazine. Currently, the magazine is issued every 2 months, but from October, C&O will be issued monthly. Mark took out a 2-year subscription terminating with the March 2020 issue, but Mark has now been informed by the publishers that, with the extra issues, his subscription will now terminate with the December 2019 issue.

To quote from Mark's email:

"I paid for a TWO YEAR subscription. If you have paid for a subscription to this magazine - do look and check when it expires with the date and time of the original expiry date. A subscription is a legal document in TIME as well as issues - if the supplier then changes the terms substantially which the publishers have now done - they MUST honour the terms and conditions of the original purchase agreement.

*Do take time to check the subscriptions you have. I paid **£41.49 for two years** - now the publicly advertised ONE year sub is **£71.88** with minor discounts to £62 for direct debit.*

I have complained to Sally Boettcher, their Customer Service Director on 01722 716997, who put me onto their Circulation Manager, who having listened to what I said has restored my subscription expiry date to March 2020 ."

Almost every surviving organ built by this builder is in the north of England.

11:15 Coach leaves to go to Steeple Ashton.

Organ 1877 Bryceston Bros & Ellis, 1956 Percy Daniel; 2011 Stephen Cooke of Westbury carried out an overhaul, currently Liberty organs (Gary Cook) looks after this fine instrument. Compass 56/30.

All Saints – limited churchyard parking, High Street parking charged – meters. NB access from Church Street to All Saints -pedestrianised.

Monday 14th to Friday 18th October 2019: Yorkshire Tour

Our members David Wilks and Pat Flynn have arranged a tour to visit the restored Hill organ at Selby Abbey, the Compton/Wood organ at Wakefield Cathedral together with a number of notable instruments in the area.

A draft itinerary appeared in the 2019 July Newsletter and we shall be visiting nearly all those places.

Accommodation on a room and breakfast basis has been reserved at the Holiday Inn Express, Wakefield (arriving Sunday 13th and leaving Friday 18th October) within easy reach of both Wakefield railway stations. A coach (38 seats) will be provided for travel outside Wakefield.

Lunches, dinners etc. will be at your own choice and cost.

Saturday November 16th 2019: Bishop's Stortford

11:00 St Michaels P.C. Windhill, CM23 2ND

Recently reconstructed in 2016 by Mander Organs, this is now basically a new organ using almost all of the original 1888 Kirkland pipework with additions by Walkers, Nicholsons and Manders.

It is now a very fine Parish Church Organ - Gt 12; Sw 10; Ch 12; Ped 10.

12:30 - 14:00 Lunch

There are numerous eateries in Town within very easy walking distance of this and the next church.

14:15 Water Lane U.R.C. Water Lane, CM23 2JZ

Organ by William Hill 1898, rebuilt by H.N&B in 1952 with pneumatic action and then again in 1995 when it was electrified and a detached console added.

Gt 8; Sw 10; Ped 6.

16:00 All Saints' Hockerill, Stansted Road, CM23 2DY

Overhauled and enlarged earlier this year by Willis, who built the original organ in 1937. The organ uses the extension principle owing to an extremely tight chamber and now produces a noble sound in this beautiful church.

Gt 11; Sw 10; Ped 10.

17:30 Hockerill Anglo European College, Dunmow Road, CM23 5HX

Originally by Hill (1878) and then overhauled by H.N&B in 1923, the organ was then drastically altered by Anthony Worsdell before being returned to its original specification by Johnsons in more recent years.

Gt 5; Sw 4; Ped 2.

Car parking - there are numerous town centre car parks very close to the first two churches with just a short ten to fifteen minute walk up the hill to Hockerill in the afternoon. Charge is £4.40 for all day parking.

For those who don't feel like walking up the Hill to All Saints there will be parking available at the Anglo European college (only available in the afternoon) which is just around the corner from All Saints.

There is also parking at the first church (St Michaels) for just 3 or 4 cars strictly for those with walking difficulties please.

Organ Taster Day for Pianists - including a Celebrity Recital by Daniel Moulton. An opportunity to hear and play the King of Instruments, & to find out how it works. Bring a piano piece to play/doodle with a few notes, or just come and listen. This is for anyone, young and old, who is interested in maybe learning to play the organ.

Daniel Moulton will conclude the proceedings with a Celebrity Recital at 17:00 – including pieces by Mendelssohn, Widor, Stanford, Whitlock, Hough, Vaughan Williams and Dupré.
