### President Elect

Owing to a change in circumstances, William Saunders has declined to accept the Presidency of the Organ Club which was to be conferred at the next AGM.

We are very delighted to announce that Paul Hale has accepted the position of President Elect, and will become the President at the next AGM.

Paul will be well known to most members – he has vast and distinguished experience as an Organ Consultant and Advisor, as a Concert Organist, a teacher, Choral Conductor, and as a contributor to the Organists' Review journal.

We look forward to having Paul “on board”, not just as a club member (for over 40 years), but as our President.

### Membership Matters

It does not seem possible we are reaching the end of 2020, and that COVID-19 has totally wrecked the careful planning of most groups.

On a positive note – The Organ Club January event was combined, as requested, with the Bloomsbury day. Despite Storm Dennis the February Masterclass at St Michael's Cornhill did take place – albeit with lower numbers than expected due to transport difficulties. The Club has managed to produce Newsletters regularly, including a quiz organised by John Miley & John Varney. Despite external difficulties all three Journals have been completed (2020/3 expected in November).

Going forward we plan all three Journals in 2021, likewise our 6 Newsletters. The Club has all the usual overheads to pay (including 3 postal rate increases during 2020).

At the committee meeting held by Zoom on 16 October, it was agreed that the membership rates for 2021 will remain the same as for 2020. ## 4. Royal Mail Christmas 2020 Collectors Sheet

The government might be cancelling Christmas this year, who knows, but the Royal Mail are doing their bit to cheer us up by issuing a delightful collectible featuring the Christmas 2020 stained-glass Nativity scenes on 20 special stamps alongside labels capturing enhanced sections of the windows and quotes about the art of stained-glass windows.

The stamps are set against the strikingly illuminated stained-glass windows of St Mary's Church, "Norfolk" (the actual village is not disclosed in the Royal Mail publicity), and are shown on the next page.

### **Organ marathon event on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2020 – organists required!**

This will take place at the Church of Our Lady of the Assumption & St Gregory, Warwick Street, London W1. The organ at the church was installed in 1790 and has been rebuilt regularly since then. The last major rebuilding was by Mander in 1960.

As a result of the Covid-19 virus and the lockdown the church's income has dropped significantly. We have therefore decided to launch an appeal for £50,000 to help maintain the high standards of music in the church.

Our first fund-raising event will be a 12-hour organ marathon on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2020. This event will last for 9am to 9pm and will include two sung Masses, one at 12.00 noon and one at 6pm.

Sixteen organists have registered to play!

Organ Club members are welcome to attend.

There is no admission charge, but donations are welcome - £10 is suggested.

## Sad News

It is with sadness that I report the death of two Organ Club members.

**Caroline Pearce** died on September 15<sup>th</sup> in her home city, Adelaide. We first met Caroline on the Organ Club tour of Memmingen and became good friends. Caroline was only the second Australian woman to be ordained priest and the first to return as a pioneer. She was also involved with the Guide movement. She leaves behind her loving husband, Bill, a member of the Organ Club for over 10 years, and four daughters, Rachel, Joanna, Alison, and Kazzia, and four grandsons.

**Oenone Cox** died on October 21<sup>st</sup>. We met Oenone and husband Laurence at the Paris tour in 2009 and on numerous other tours in the UK and abroad. Oenone was a fine organist and pianist as well as a vibrant painter. She played many times on organ club visits and was a talented improviser. She leaves behind her beloved husband Laurence, her sister Manya, her nieces and many friends.

## 2. CLUB MEETINGS

It is still unclear when churches will be allowed to host visits from organisations like the Organ Club, or to hold concerts and recitals. There will be no visits for the remainder of 2020.

It is with regret that the London Organ Club Competition in December has been postponed, again due to the Covid-19 situation.

### **Monday 28th & Tuesday 29th December 2020: The London Organ Competition 2020**

(St. Clement Danes, Strand, London WC2R 1DH)

**Postponed.** This event will now take place at St Clement Danes on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> December 2021.

**In the Pipeline:** The following visits are planned; full details will be given nearer to the time. Please note them in your diary! (though please bear in mind that these could be **subject to change**, particularly in view of the Covid-19 pandemic).

### **Saturday May 22<sup>nd</sup> 2021 (4th Saturday) Mini-tour**

Organs at Buckfast Abbey, Totnes & Torquay, to include a trip on the South Devon Steam Railway.

### **Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2021: walking tour - "Lower" Windsor parish churches.**

(Originally scheduled for June 20<sup>th</sup> 2020).

We will visit about 5 churches (including All Saints, last OC visit in 1931 when organ was new, and Holy Trinity Garrison church), not normally on the tourist trail!

### **Saturday July 17<sup>th</sup> 2021: Gorleston/Lowestoft**

(Originally scheduled for July 18<sup>th</sup> 2020).

### **Isle of Man Tour** (Originally scheduled for September 2020)

We are now looking to hold this tour in September **2022** with the expectation of avoiding Covid related problems – dates to be decided, but will be a week between September 5<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>.

### **A week exploring organs, with some Victorian transport**

The Isle of Man has much of interest. We will focus on seeing some of the organs in the some of the many churches and chapels on the island, but will also have the opportunity to experience Victorian rail travel and in the process see some splendid scenery in this essentially rural country.

The island is a Crown Protectorate with its own parliament, legal system and currency. As an independent state of fewer than 90,000 residents that recognises the Queen as 'Lord of Mann', it has never been a member of the EU.
