I bought this organ about four years ago from a private vendor in Holland. It was made by Van Vulpen, (<https://www.vulpen-orgel.nl/?p=364>), a Dutch organ building company in Utrecht who made quite a number of these small chamber/house organs in the late 1970s and 80s, designed to fit within normal ceilings. Van Vulpen assessed and dismantled the organ and made minor refurbishments (replacing felts etc.) and then brought it over and installed it in my home.

It has two manuals and seven stops as follows:

Man 1 Gedackt 8' , Flute 4', Larigot 1 1/3

Man 2 Gedackt 8' (shared with manual 1, but with its own stop knob), Principal 2', Regal 8' (situated at the front of the case for easy tuning access)

Ped Sordun 16' - a soft reed, which is situated under the manuals and behind the pedalboard, giving easy access for tuning. The volume is adjustable by opening or closing the footboard via a stop knob.

Couplers: Man 1 to Pedal, Man 2 to pedal, Man 1 to Man 2.

Dimensions: Height 218cm Width 133cm Depth (to back of bench) 122 cm.

Manual compass c-g 56 notes

Pedal compass c-f 30 notes

Weight: about 350kgs. Mechanical action throughout.

The organ has a straight pedalboard and the dimensions are compact. Its light and even mechanical action demands (and therefore teaches) careful touch and technique. Access to the pipes is easy via the front doors, and both reed stops are situated at the front of the case for tuning access. The display pipes are real but non-speaking. It has an integral blower and a small bellows all within the case. Due to building work the organ has been partially dismantled (pipes removed and packed in pipe racks) - again by Van Vulpen - and stored in our adjoining garage. It is in excellent cosmetic and mechanical condition apart from a faint coffee ring mark on the right hand side of the console from the previous owner. MALTON, North Yorkshire - The Wesley Centre

A contact made during the writing of the Christmas stamps article (OCJ 2021/1, pages 28 - 33) has led to the discovery of an interesting project taking place in Malton. The Forster & Andrews organ, originally in the Royal Normal College for the Blind in Upper Norwood, London and latterly in Hailsham Parish Church, is currently at Henry Willis in Liverpool for restoration and installation later in 2022 at the Wesley Centre. As a result I am delighted to welcome Paul Emberley who is running the project to Organ Club Membership. More details to follow.

In the Pipeline

The following visits are planned; full details will be given nearer to the time. Please note them in your diary! (though please bear in mind that these could be **subject to change**, particularly in view of the Covid-19 pandemic).

Saturday September 25th 2021, Canterbury Cathedral

We are invited to Choral Evensong, after which David Newsholme, acting Director of Music at the Cathedral, will give a short recital, after which members can play. This is an exciting opportunity to see, hear and play a large new organ by Harrison & Harrison Ltd, based on the Father Willis pipework. You can whet your appetite by viewing some interesting video clips of the restoration – just Google “YouTube New Organ Installed – Canterbury Cathedral”.

We also hope to visit another church before lunch and then be conducted on a guided tour of the cathedral in the afternoon, following which there will be tea and then we are invited to observe the cathedral choir being rehearsed for Evensong - a great privilege, perhaps helped by the fact that David Newsholme is the President's godson!

Saturday October 16th 2021: Cirencester

We start with a brief visit to Down Ampney [1/9 Walker] on the way to Central Cirencester - St John Baptist and its new 4m Harrison, also based on a body of Fr. Willis pipes.

This will be followed by a walk to Holy Trinity Watermoor 3/29 Bishop. To end the day, to Ampney Crucis, the organ restored in 2019 - 2/13 “ANON”. The key church is St John's and the sequences may change in the light of events. A coach is being sought to collect members from Swindon Station. More details when available.
