First stop is the Royal Family's private Chapel of All Saints' in Windsor Great



Park (2m Lewis, rebuilt 2024 by Nicholson). This building is not accessible to the public. We are privileged to have been invited by Canon Martin Poll (Chaplain to the King) and the Director of Music (Richard Furstenheim).

There will be a short demonstration, and time for members to play the organ (console pictured left).

A sandwich lunch will be provided at about 12:30. If the weather is fine, we can eat in the garden. The coach will leave at 1:30, to transport us to Hampton Court.

We hope to arrive at around 2:30 at the Palace of Hampton Court, where we shall be ushered into the magnificent Royal Chapel (pictured right). There will be a demonstration of the historic organ (1690 Father Smith, Hill, Walker, 2013 Harrisons). The Director of Music and Club member, Carl Jackson MVO, will talk to us about the organ and the music of the Chapel. It is planned that the President will present Carl with a certificate to mark his Vice-Presidency of The Organ Club. There will be time to play the organ.

It is hoped that the coach will deliver members back to Egham station by 5:00pm.



On the day, you may be asked to show photo-id. Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. There will be a charge of £30 per person (which covers lunch, transportation and all other costs). You are requested to submit payment to the Organ Club account (account details given on page 1 of this newsletter) ASAP.

#### June 10th to 14th 2025: Norfolk Tour

There has been a great response for this tour, with 44 members and guests currently registered! This promises to be a stunning tour! If you haven't paid your tour fees yet, please do so asap, as the deadline set by the organiser, Paul Hale, has already passed.

Some members will not be able to come on the complete Norfolk Tour. However, you will be very welcome to join the party on SATURDAY  $14^{\rm th}$  JUNE.

We shall be meeting at St Peter Mancroft (Peter Collins organ, 3/38) in time to hear a recital by the superb Spanish organist, Loreto Aramendi, at 1:00. (The church's organist, Julian Haggett, will welcome our party, and there may be a chance to play the organ afterwards.)

We then move to Norwich Anglican Cathedral, where the organ has recently been substantially rebuilt (HNB/Harrison, 4/103). The Master of Music (Ashley Grote) and the Organist (David Dunnett) will talk about the organ and demonstrate it. They will be happy for members to play the instrument. We are privileged to be given access to such an iconic organ. [There will be a charge of £10 for members joining us just for the Saturday.] If you feel hungry or thirsty during the day, it is worth knowing that the Cathedral Refectory will be open till 6:00, serving drinks, snacks and light meals, with particularly delicious pastries and a vast array of different types of hot chocolate!

Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell gave the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading organ builders, and it was last restored in 2010 by Nicholsons of Malvern. Organists of the church have included the 18th century composer William Boyce (here for 32 years), as well as Harold Darke (50 years) and Richard Popplewell. The [Royal] College of Organists was founded here in the 19th century. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world (it began in 1914).

The continuation of this well-known series depends on the support of the audience. Please be generous as you leave. There is a bowl for cash, as well as two card-readers (for debit or credit cards) and a QR code on display.
